


Guest Lecture


Student' Feedback:






Brief Report:





The objective of the activity is to familiarize the students with the topics prescribed in the syllabus while identifying the names of the authors and poets.


Brief Report:


 This language activity helped us attain the course outcome of improving LSRW skills as the students could listen, write down the names of the topics and authors, read them accordingly and pronounce them correctly.
