They were known for the construction of a network of tanks for irrigation and drinking water and thereby gave a big boost to the overall development of the regionRudradeva (1158-1195): Rudra who ruled during A.D. 1158-1195, was a very much renowned ruler in Kakatiya Dynasty. As he stretched his empire till the north as far as tills the Godavari Delta. To serve as a second capital, he constructed the fort at Warangal and also faced the invasions of Yadavas of Devagiri.
